Congratulations to our Year 11s who collected their results over the summer. We, again, achieved a positive Progress 8 score (provisionally +0.13) and we had our best ever pass rate for pupils gaining a grade 5 or better in both English and Maths of 45.1%. We are immensely proud of both the academic results they achieved and the people they have become. We wish them all the best for the future.

Site improvements

We have invested in our IT infrastructure with significant work over the summer which will make our IT systems safer and quicker for all users.

We have also invested in air conditioning for the hall. This will provide us with optimum conditions for exams each summer as well as giving us a large, cool space for pupils to access on hot days.

West Midlands Academy Trust update

Especially to update those parents and carers joining us with pupils in Year 7, the Governing Bodies of Hall Green School, Kings Norton Girls' School, and Swanshurst School proposed in spring 2024 to jointly establish a new multi-academy trust (West Midlands Academy Trust, WMAT) and for all three schools to become academy schools within WMAT.

Hall Green, Kings Norton and Swanshurst are each high-performing, popular and successful. We share high aspirations for our pupils, high expectations of staff and pupils, and cultures of excellence. This proposal is about our shared commitment to future improvement. We are proposing to establish West Midlands Academy Trust (WMAT) because we believe that there are advantages for our pupils and staff.

Public consultation was held during June 2024. The consultation document and a more detailed Question and Answer document were issued to stakeholders, and both are available on this webpage <u>https://www.hallgreen.bham.sch.uk/wmat-academy-consultation/</u>. A report detailing the consultation process, feedback received and responses to questions raised is available on this webpage alongside further information. The Governing Body of each school considered all of the consultation responses.

In July 2024 the Governing Body of each school made the decision to proceed with establishing WMAT. It is anticipated that the schools would transfer to WMAT in early 2025.

The schools have confirmed that each school will retain its school name, its age-range, school uniform, admissions criteria, and existing staff. Term dates will continue to be set within the context of local schools. Hall Green will continue to be co-educational, while Kings Norton and Swanshurst will continue to educate girls for Year 7 to Year 11 and have co-educational Sixth Forms.

I will update you during this term as our work towards joining WMAT continues. The webpage above will be updated also.

Road safety

As many of you will know, our entrance to school can be congested for the dismissal of over 900 pupils. Some of our pupils also require transport which needs to come onto the school grounds. For this reason, it is vital that pupils who do not need these adaptations ensure they are collected a couple of roads away if being picked up/dropped off. This eases the congestion and makes the road area far safer for all of our pupils.

It is also important to respect our neighbours and I urge parents/carers not to park on or across the drives of local residents, even if just for a short time. Please also ensure engines are not left running.
